



Foreign Office Meeting

Although CCND will not be represented this year at the NPT PrepCom, it is still useful to see what our delegation will be saying.

Patricia Pulham and Caroline Gilbert attended the Round Table meeting in the Old Admiralty building this year, on 10th April. (No, not demoted but change of venue due to refurbishment of FCO)

The UK chair for this meeting told us that the main agenda in New York would be concerned with drawing up a framework for a reporting structure so that the signatory nations could tell us in 2015 what had been achieved from the Action Plan decided on in 2010. He emphasised that UK was well on track on its disarmament commitments as it had greatly

reduced its number of warheads. (No acceptance that modernisation and development of these warheads can also be seen as proliferation.)

In response to a number of questions on the failure of UK to attend the Humanitarian Conference in Mexico, he said that humanitarian issues were always considered by Britain and that nuclear weapons would only be used in extreme circumstances.

Patricia pointed out that if this were so, why did we not have a "No First Use" policy, and if this were stated, China could no longer hold the moral high ground. Caroline drew attention to the Trident programme, which as at previous meetings remained "the elephant in the room", never being brought up by the Foreign Office or MOD representatives there.



The Embassies Walk 2014 in association with ICAN - this year took in more embassies than CCND visited previously. The idea was to visit all key players at the recent Mexico Conference on Humanitarian Aspects of nuclear weapons as well as the nuclear weapons states.
